Slashes Throat, Passes Away in Elgin Hospital

Tom Bozich, 68, of 616 Hermes Ave., died late yesterday afternoon at the Elgin State hospital of self-inflicted wounds incurred Wednesday night.

Found Thursday noon, sitting in the rear yard of his home, with his throat slashed, Bozich told Patrolman Jack Moga, whose residence adjoins Bozich's, that he had slashed his throat during the night Wednesday because he no longer wanted to live. Altho weak from the loss of blood, he was not believed to be in critical condition.

Immediately Bozich was taken to St. Charles hospital for treatment of the self-inflicted wound. Following treatment he was removed to the Elgin hospital, where he died soon after his arrival. Bozich had been ill for several years and unable to work. He lived alone at the Hermes Avenue address and is not believed to have any relatives.
