Transient Hurt by Automobile Dies of Injury

* Orlando Darling, 75, a transient, died at St. Joseph Mercy hospital early today as a result of injuries received on the night of October 16 when he was struck by an automobile driven by F. S. Hawbaker, of Shabbona.

The accident occurred shortly after 9 o'clock in the Galena boulevard road about a half mile west of Aurora. Hawbaker, accompanied by his wife, three daughters and son-in-law, Albert Peterson, 5463 Kimbark avenue, Chicago, was driving west in the highway when, blinded by the lights of an approaching car, he ran into Darling who was walking in the same direction on the right side of the pavement.

The injured man was taken by Deputy Sheriff Edward P. Martin to St. Joseph Mercy hospital, where he was attended by Dr. W. E. Curtiss. Suffering from a leg injury, he later developed peritonitis, which necessitated amputation of the member. The body has been removed to the George M. Boyle home, where an inquest will be held tomorrow.

Darling said his home was at Wheeling, Mich.
