Dies Suddenly of Heart Attack

John Sylvester O'Connor, 67, was
found dead in his bed at 123 South
LaSalle street shortly after 4 o'clock
this morning by Anton Anderson
with whom he lived. O'Connor had

tion for some time, and on April
1 was taken to St. Charles hospital
by police ambulance for care.
