Aged Man Is Found Dead of Heart Attack

Edward Roberts, 87 year old resi-
dent of the Kane county home, died
this morning on an Elgin-Aurora
bus en route to Aurora from Ba-
tavia.

At the Aurora terminal, Rob-
erts, believed to have been sleep-
ing since he went to a seat on the
bus and slumped over, was found
dead by the driver, T. R. Moroney,
407 Spruce street, and Jerome Wa-
terman, 177 North Fourth street,
passenger who had been sitting be-
hind the elderly man. At the ter-
minal when the bus pulled in were
Patrolmen Frank Carroll and Wil-
liam Peters who examined Roberts.
Roberts was then removed to St.
Charles hospital by Patrolmen Paul
Rydquist and Earl Retterer in a
police ambulance, where he was
pronounced dead.

Waterman, who was seated in the
bus when Roberts boarded the coach
at Batavia, stated that he had
slumped over in his seat, as tho
sleeping, shortly after sitting down.
When he failed to move from his
seat at the terminal, the driver
investigated and found that he
had died.
