## Frank E. Sessler Dies Suddenly

Frank Edward Sessler, 62, night watchman for the Stegmann auto wrecking company, 610 Ogden avenue, was found dead this morning at his home, 619 Ogden avenue.

Sessler, who was last seen alive about 9 o'clock last night, was discovered this morning by his employer, Richard R. Stegmann who, unable to find his employe, went to the latter's home and peered thru the window. He saw Sessler, garbed only in his underwear, lying on the floor beside his bed, where he had evidently collapsed.

Dr. Karl J. Kaiser was summoned and pronounced Sessler dead, the body being removed to the Corcoran funeral home. Police investigation was made by Capt. Fred S. Hess and Patrolmen Harry Montgomery and Frank Carroll.
