BATTLE Jim Always Was a Loner, Even in Death

Jim Tyndell, 63, who always went his own way and never harmed anyone but himself, was found dead yesterday afternoon. His body was pulled from Indian creek where it leads into Fox river north of the Consumer company yards in North Broadway. He had been here for years but had no established address.

Jim was last seen alive Thursday afternoon by William Tosaw, clerk at the Consumers company office, 464 North Broadway, who noticed the lanky fellow pass the window. Site of the drowning was in the rear of the office below a railroad trestle which spans the creek.

It is presumed that Tyndell fell, filliking his head on one of the ties, and plummeted into the water which is quite shallow at that point. The body was discovered by two young boys, Lyle McNickel, 561 New York street, and Jack Metzger, 617 New York street, who were playing along the creek.

A verdict of accidental death was returned by a coroner's jury at an inquest held by Coroner L. Victor Peterson at the Corcoran funeral home. Police have contacted a sister, Mrs. Celia Sharp, of St. Louis, Mo., regarding funeral arrangements.
